



1. BASIC INFORMATION ABOUT THE FESTIVAL

The 23rd Ji.hlava International Documentary Film Festival took place on October 24–29.

This year, the focus on the documentary Ji.hlava was on the environment.

"We have always tried to keep the environment in mind. We want to be consistent and plan our subsequent steps based on the latest findings. We are trying to find savings within our system and perhaps become an inspiration to others." The 23rd Ji.hlava IDFF will therefore introduce the environmental ombudsman who will "serve as a direct contact between the festival and the visitors: and introduce Ji.hlava's environmental practices to the public. This is a long-term commitment, not a one-off activity. Some things will not change immediately, but we want to adopt a more consistent environmental attitude that would become a natural and integral part of our event."

Jihlava International Documentary Film Festival is the largest festival of creative documentary film in Central and Eastern Europe. The festival follows the essential tendencies in world documentary film, with a focus on creative cinema.

The Jihlava festival was attended by **5,330** accredited participants, including **1,163** film professionals, **146** festival guests and **300** journalists. The accompanying programme Ji.hlava for Kids issued **500** accreditations, with a total of **4,159** participants. **6,000** persons engaged in the Inspiration Forum discussion platform. The festival addresses primarily high school and university students. The overall attendance of the Ji.hlava IDFF programme was over **42,000** visitors.

Every October, Ji.hlava hosts representatives of leading film festivals and televisions, big and small producers and distributors, film journalists – and of course filmmakers and visitors. The festival creates a natural space for education, addressing a wide range of audiences. Its creative atmosphere is unique thanks to discussions with directors, seminars and lectures, music performances and a rich programme for kids.

The festival's **Industry Programme** is traditionally focused on the support of documentary film, primarily in Central and Eastern Europe. This year's Industry Programme was attended by over 1,100 film professionals; directors, film and television producers, buyers from key European and American television stations, representatives of Czech and international film festivals and funds, distributors, sales agents and other guests.

This year saw the eighth edition of the **Emerging Producers** project, showcasing eighteen talented European producers.

The festival also hosted the 9th edition of the **Festival Identity** workshop; a meeting of representatives of international film festivals, accompanied by the competition exhibition of festival posters from 2018 to 2019.

This year we saw the third edition of the **Ji.hlava Academy** – educational, networking and inspirational platform for all those who create contemporary films and reflect on contemporary cinema.



INSPIRATION FORUM

The ninth edition of the Inspiration Forum that this year for the second time spanned all six festival days invited visitors to almost forty debates and hosted 104 guests from across the world. The topics covered ranged from climate crisis, through democracy, women in the third millennium, to contemporary China and how not to be afraid of it. This year, the Inspiration Forum's guests included American climate expert Bill McKibben, Afghani human-rights activist and presidential candidate Fawzia Koofi and future generations commissioner in Wales, Sophie Howe. The Inspiration Forum discussion platform attracted 6000 visitors.








JI.HLAVA FOR KIDS

The second edition of Ji.hlava for Kids more than doubled the success of the programme in the previous year.

Although the festival audience and the Ji.hlava IDFF are growing up together and founding families, we also keep the youngest documentary film fans in mind. We teamed up with the Center for Documetnary Film dedicated to audiovisual education to prepare the Ji.hlava for Kids programme. The platform for kids offered twenty-four blocks with workshops, nineteen film screenings and other off-screen events. The programme took place at the Vysočina Regional Gallery and was designed for children aged o to 14. The smallest children can play in the children's zone in the company of festival assistants. Older children could combine fun and learning at the animation workshops with artists Mařenka Urbánková and Tereza Nová, René Nekuda presented his Příběhostroj (Story-telling Machine). The programme included concerts, theatre performances, docs for children and bed-time stories.

This year's Ji.hlava for Kids will newly be interconnected with the programme for adults, namely the Inspiration Forum. Personalities from all different walks of life will visit the children – and children will become the participants of the discussion forum for adults


TARGET GROUP OF THE FESTIVAL

The largest demographic group in terms of the festival visitors are people aged 18 to 40, with higher education and interested in social issues and culture. Festival visitors come mainly from larger Czech cities, but also from Slovakia.

Media promotion on Czech Television

Czech Television broadcast 36 spots promoting the 23rd Ji.hava International Documentary Film Festival with 32.10 % GRP, and 19.71 % Reach. The spot was seen by a total of 1,689,040 viewers. Television audiences could traditionally watch the closing ceremony entitled "Documentary Joy from Jihlava". The Tuesday evening broadcast on Czech Television Art was followed by average 4 thousand viewers in the 15+ category, 0.21 % share, total reach of 22 thousand.

Cristi Puiu

Romanian director and screenwriter. He is considered the founder of the Romanian New Wave and one of the most important contemporary European filmmakers. He made the award-winning films The Death of Mr. Lazarescu (2005), Aurora (2010), and Stuff & Dough (2001). His last film Sieranevada, which was nominated for the Academy Award for Foreign Language Film in 2016, is his fourth feature film, and the third in the series Six Tales from the Bucharest Suburbs, inspired by Rohmer's Six Moral Tales. He is currently working on a fifth feature film, a drama set in the early 20th century.

Sergey Dvortsevoy

Kazakh director and documentarian of a Russian origin. He is often grouped with the Russian New Wave, which was formed at the turn of the millennium as a result of efforts to reflect the state of Russian society and a range of socio-economic issues through the medium of film. His Bread Day won the historically first Ji.hlava IDFF's Audience Award in 1999.





Fawzia Koofi

Afghani politician and writer. She is an outspoken advocate for the rights of women and children and democracy. Koofi started her political career in 2001 when she began to promote a "Back To School" campaign targeted at the rights of women in Afghanistan to an education. By 2002 she took employment as a Child Protection Officer with UNICEF, and in 2005 she was elected as a parliamentary representative. She heads the parliament's Women Affairs Commission.

Bill McKibben

An American author and environmentalist. His book The End of Nature (1989), regarded as the first educational book for a general audience about climate change, has appeared in 24 languages. He is a founder of 350.org, the first planet-wide, grass-roots climate change movement, which has organized more than 20,000 rallies around the world. He lives in the mountains above Lake Champlain with his wife, the writer Sue Halpern.


Game Zone

The off-screen programme also included theatre performances, an exhibition of posters of Czech and foreign film festivals, a display of paintings by filmmaker Karel Vachek who brought his Communism and the Net or the End of Representative Democracy to the 23rd Ji.hlava IDFF.

All five festival days were topped up with parties featuring glowing names on the contemporary music scene tailor made to Ji.hlava by Radio Wave as part of its Night Scene programme.





DOC ALLIANCE AND DAFILMS.CZ

Doc Alliance is a platform resulting from a creative partnership among 7 key European documentary film festivals: CPH:DOX Copenhagen, Doclisboa, DOK Leipzig, FID Marseille, MFDF Ji.hlava, Planete Doc Film Festival and Visions du Réel Nyon. The mission of Doc Alliance is to support documentary film and its diversity, and to constantly raise awareness about the fascinating possibilities of this genre which is often more impressive than fiction. The aim of Doc Alliance is to create an inventive and dynamic distribution platform for directors and producers and to offer their films an attractive alternative on their way to the spectators and systematically support their distribution on festival markets and the self-operated DAFilms.cz platform.

INSTITUTE OF DOCUMENTARY FILM AT THE 23rd JIHLAVA IDFF

Industry activities organised in Jihlava by the Institute of Documentary Film

EAST SILVER MARKET

Institute of Documentary Film at the Ji.hlava IDFF organises the annual East Silver Market presenting a selection of new docs made in Central and Eastern Europe. Over 750 documentary films were registered for the 16th edition of the market. Industry guests - festival programmers, sales agents, television representatives and other film professionals - had the chance to see exactly 300 films finished in the previous year in the video library. Statistics confirm that East Silver is traditionally a very popular part of the festival. "This year, East Silver Market's library counted a total of 867 views. Over 105 festival films were included in the market," says Zdeněk Blaha, the manager of the East Silver. Most popular were Kings of Šumava (dir. Kris Kelly), FREM (dir. Viera Čákanyová), #sandrainuganda (dir. Filip Remunda), Kiruna - A Brand New World (dir. Greta Stocklassa) and Talking about Adultery (dir. Bára Jíchová Tyson).

EX ORIENTE FILM

Twelve world-acclaimed lecturers came to Jihlava on October 23 to 28 to focus on director-producer connections – participants of a workshop dealing with the financing and legal aspects of co-productions and the visual analysis of their emerging documentary projects. Invitation to the Ex Oriente Film workshop was accepted by film professionals, invited by IDF not only for the workshop participants but 11 programme sessions (case studies, masterclasses, lectures and screenings) were also open to holders of all types of festival passes.

Most visitors attended the masterclass by Atanas Georgiev (editor and producer of Honeyland) and a case study of producer Julianna Ugrin about the film, A Woman Captured, and director and cinematographer Erick Stoll talking about the film, América.

The workshop will culminate with the pitching of all 12 participating project at the East Doc Forum on March 12, 2020. Nine other selected documentary projects will take part together with three interactive works. The East Doc Forum is the climax of the East Doc Platform, the largest international film market in the region of Central and Eastern Europe held on March 7–13, 2020.

KINEDOK

Another project of the Institute of Documentary Film – unique film club and alternative distribution platform KineDok – organizing the traditional meeting of representatives of all partner countries at Ji.hlava IDFF (Czech Republic, Slovakia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Hungary, Romania, Poland and Norway) to evaluate the previous functioning and to prepare the programming strategy for the upcoming edition.

SILVER EYE AWARDS 2019

Institute of Documentary Film under the auspices of Creative Europe MEDIA again granted Silver Eye Awards to the best Central- and Eastern European films to assist them with promotion, finding a distributor and screening the film at international film festivals and on television. A financial prize of EUR 2,500 and a yearlong festival support of the East Silver Caravan in the same amount was granted in the feature-length category to Transnistria by Anna Eborn, capturing a fragment in the life of several teenagers in the unacknowledged state of Transnistria. A Special Mention in this category was granted to Polish film **The Wind A Documentary Thriller** by Michal Bielawski takes an original look at the life of inhabitants of Polish Tatras on the backdrop of the legend of the local wind that drives people mad.

The short-length category was won by Czech film **Pripyat Piano** by director Eliška Cílková shedding unexpected light on the place of the Chernobyl catastrophe. Special Mention in the short-length category was given to Estonian film, Waiting for a Miracle by Aljona Suržikova that was appreciated for its tragic and deeply intimate story of the author herself.



Visual concept of the festival. Graduated from the Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design in Prague; works as head of its Illustration and Graphics Studio since 2003. Holder of the prestigious Leipzig Book Fair Prize for the world's most beautiful book, as well as multiple holder of the Most Beautiful Czech Book announced by the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic.
